


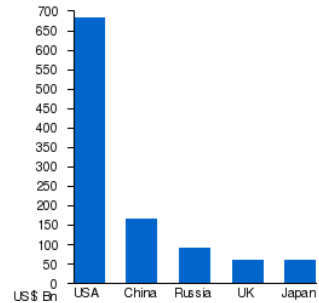


The best Military Money can buy

Flash back to the past: if one doesn’t learn from history then they will repeat it.

On the grounds of the Texas State Capitol in Austin Texas is a monument to the Confederate soldiers (erected in 1903). This monument foretells the future of the US military. The monument lists the

starting and ending number of troops for both the Confederate and Federal armies. Both lost roughly an equal amount of troops however it's the starting numbers that tell the story. The Federal army had 2 million more troops starting off than that of the Confederate army. At the end of the war the Confederate army only had 163,000 troops compared with the Federal army of over 2 million.

RSV Joshua 21:43-45

43 Thus the Lord gave to Israel all the land which he swore to give to their fathers; and having taken possession of it, they settled there.

44 And **the Lord gave them rest on every side** just as he had sworn to their fathers; **not one of all their enemies had withstood them**, for *the Lord had given all their enemies into their hands*.

45 Not one of all the good promises which the Lord had made to the house of Israel had failed; all came to pass.

In WW2 Japan realized that they couldn't invade the US due to its well-armed population.

Admiral Isoroku Yamamoto: You cannot invade the mainland United States. There would be a rifle behind each blade of grass.



Abraham Lincoln stated we would fall due to enemies within our government & country. Our national leaders have pushed our military overseas and have been attempting to disarm the American people – in many places quite successfully.



Abraham Lincoln: America will never be destroyed from the outside. If we falter and lose our freedom, it will be because we destroyed ourselves.

Looking in the bible at Israel's past we see that large armies along with the high tech equipment of the day (horses and chariots) didn't win the battle every single time.

In 1 Kings 20:1-30 Ben-Hadad, king of Syria brought 32 kings with horses and chariots to attack king Ahab of the Nation of Israel - 1Kg 20:1. Israel in verse 15 could only muster 7,000 soldiers against a Syrian force in excess of 127,000 soldiers. Israel routed the Syrian army with God's help – 1Kg 20:20-21. Ben-Hadad came back the following year with an equal amount of forces. Israel was described in verse 27 as two little flocks of goats and Syria filled the land. Israel, with God's help, killed 127,000 soldiers – 1Kg 20:28-30.

DRB 1 Kings 20:1-30

1 And Ben-Hadad king of Syria assembled all his host; and there were **thirty-two kings with him, and horses and chariots**; and he went up and besieged Samaria, and fought against it.

15 And he numbered the servants of the princes of the provinces, and they were two hundred and thirty-two; and after them he numbered all the people, **all the children of Israel, seven thousand.**

20 And they slew every one his man; and the Syrians fled, and Israel pursued them; and Ben-Hadad the king of Syria escaped on a horse with the horsemen.

21 And the king of Israel went out, and smote the horses and chariots, and slew the Syrians with a great slaughter.

22 And the prophet drew near to the king of Israel, and said to him, Go, strengthen thyself, and understand, and see what thou shalt do; for at the return of the year the king of Syria will come up against thee.

23 And the servants of the king of Syria said to him, Their gods are gods of the mountains; therefore they were stronger than we; but if we fight against them on the plateau, shall we not be stronger than they?

24 And do this: take the kings away, every man out of his place, and put governors in their stead;

25 and **number thee an army, like the army that thou hast lost, horse for horse, and chariot for chariot**; and we will fight against them on the plateau: shall we not be stronger than they? And he hearkened to their voice, and did so.

26 And it came to pass, at the return of the year, that Ben-Hadad numbered the Syrians, and went up to Aphek, to fight against Israel.

27 And the children of Israel were numbered and victualled, and they went against them; and the **children of Israel encamped before them like two little flocks of goats; but the Syrians filled the land.**

28 And the man of God drew near, and spoke to the king of Israel and said, Thus saith Jehovah: Because the Syrians have said, Jehovah is a god of the mountains, but he is not a god of the valleys, I will give all this great multitude into thy hand, and ye shall know that I am Jehovah.

29 And they encamped one over against the other seven days; and it came to pass that on the seventh day the battle was joined; and the children of Israel smote of the Syrians a **hundred thousand footmen in one day.**

30 And the rest fled to Aphek, into the city; and the wall fell on **twenty-seven thousand men** of them that were left. And Ben-Hadad fled, and came into the city, from chamber to chamber.

The king of Assyria sent Rab-shakeh to attack Jerusalem in Isaiah 36:2, 37:1-38. Jerusalem was surrounded without any allies to help them. Rab-shakeh mocked king Hezekiah. Isaiah said that God would defend the city to save it in verse 35. In verse 36 and angel came down and killed 185,000 Assyrian soldiers.

DRB Isaiah 36:2

2 And the **king of Assyria sent Rab-shakeh from Lachish to Jerusalem, to king Hezekiah, with a strong force.** And he stood by the aqueduct of the upper pool, on the highway of the fuller's field.

DRB Isaiah 37:1-38

21 And Isaiah the son of Amoz sent to Hezekiah, saying, Thus saith Jehovah the God of Israel, Whereas thou hast prayed to me concerning Sennacherib king of Assyria,

35 And **I will defend this city, to save it,** for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

36 And **an angel of Jehovah went forth, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians a hundred and eighty-five thousand.** And when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead bodies.

37 And Sennacherib king of Assyria departed, and went and returned, and abode at Nineveh.

God defended the Israelites coming out of Egypt by killing all of Pharaoh's military in Exodus 14:27-28 at a time when Israel didn't have any physical weapons or military training.

DRB Exodus 14:27-28

27 And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and the sea returned to its strength toward the morning; and the Egyptians fled against it; and **Jehovah overturned the Egyptians** into the midst of the sea.

28 And the **waters returned, and covered the chariots and the horsemen of all the host of Pharaoh that had come into the sea after them; there remained not even one of them.**

God doesn't need a large army to wipe out an opposing large army. God uses asynchronous fighting. An army comes and covers the ground before you and God selects a small amount of soldiers to go to battle so that no one can say that they won on their own without God's help - Judges 7:2.

RSV Judges 7:2 The Lord said to Gideon, "The people with you are too many for me to give the Midianites into their hand, **lest Israel vaunt themselves against me, saying, 'My own hand has delivered me.'**"

Gideon's army began at 32,000 (Judges 7:3) and God whittled it down to 300 men in Judges 7:6 and God gave them a great victory over Midian, Amalek and the children of the east who covered the ground as locust in verse 24 & 25.

DRB Judges 7:12 And **Midian and Amalek and all the children of the east** lay along in the valley as locusts for multitude; and their camels were without number, as the sand upon the sea-shore for multitude.

Time and time again, victory by the power of God by a small remnant. Joshua saw his help arrive in Joshua 5:13-15 when the captain of the army of Jehovah stood in front of him. The key of this introduction is in verse 15 where it said that the ground was Holy.

CT Septuagint Joshua 5:13-15

13 Now when Joshua was by Jericho, he raised his eyes, and saw a man standing before him, with a drawn sword in his hand upon which Joshua, advancing,

14 said to him, Art thou one of us or of our enemies? And he said to him, **I am the captain general of the Host of the Lord**, just arrived. At this Joshua prostrated himself, with his face to the ground, and said to him, My Lord what dost thou command thy servant?

15 And the Lord's captain general said to Joshua, **Loose the sandals from thy feet, for the place on which thou stand is holy ground.**

Verse 15 above statement of taking sandals off is significant. The other passage with the exact language is in Exodus 3:5-6 where Moses seeing the burning bush and voice of God telling him to remove his sandals. It's my belief that Joshua was looking at Jesus which to me is an awesome thought.

Ex 3:5 And he said, Draw not nigh hither: **loose thy sandals from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest is holy ground.**

Ex 3:6 And he said, I am the God of thy father, the God of Abraam, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and Moses turned away his face, for he was afraid to gaze at God.

In Joshua 10:12-14 God fought for Israel by keeping the sun up so that the enemy could be destroyed.

DRB Joshua 10:12-14

12 Then spoke Joshua to Jehovah in the day when Jehovah gave up the Amorites before the children of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel, Sun, stand still upon Gibeon; And thou, moon, in the valley of Ajalon!

13 And the sun stood still, and the moon remained where it was, until the nation had avenged themselves upon their enemies. Is not this written in the book of Jasher? And the sun remained standing in the midst of heaven, and hastened not to go down about a full day.

14 And there was no day like that before it or after it, that Jehovah hearkened to the voice of a man; **for Jehovah fought for Israel.**

The victory that Joshua saw was the direct response of the camp being Holy. In Dt23:13-14 it states that you ensure that the camp is holy since God walks in the midst of the camp and if he sees anything unholy then we would depart.

RSV Deuteronomy 23:13-14

13 and you shall have a stick with your weapons; and when you sit down outside, you shall **dig a hole with it, and turn back and cover up your excrement.**

14 **Because the Lord your God walks in the midst of your camp, to save you and to give up your enemies before you, therefore your camp must be holy, that he may not see anything indecent among you, and turn away from you.**

What is the excrement in the land today that God would find unholy enough to depart and leave us totally unprotected?

- preventing chaplains from praying to Jesus publicly
- preventing speaking of Jesus elsewhere
- repelling laws (don't ask don't tell)

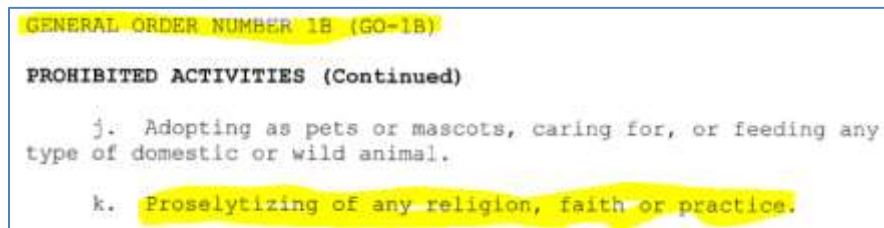
In 2006 The secretary of the Navy issues orders stating all public prayers should be inclusive to all faiths (ie don't pray in the name of Jesus).

In 2008 American troops confiscated, threw away, and burned God's Word at Bagram Air Base in Afghanistan. The Bibles were written in the Pashto and Dari languages, and the Defense Department was concerned the books might somehow be used to convert Afghans.

But there was another reason the Bibles were confiscated. Military rules forbid troops from proselytizing in the country.

U.S. Central Command's General Order No. 1 (March 13 2006 version) The order is now at GO-1C (May 21, 2013) which greatly accommodates Muslims (that order is in the back).



Congress passed and Pres Obama signed the NDAA in 2012 backs up this order by forcing military Chaplains to accommodate other beliefs.

“National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2013”.

SEC. 533. PROTECTION OF RIGHTS OF CONSCIENCE OF MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES AND CHAPLAINS OF SUCH MEMBERS.

(a) PROTECTION OF RIGHTS OF CONSCIENCE.—

(1) ACCOMMODATION.—The Armed Forces shall accommodate the beliefs of a member of the armed forces reflecting the conscience, moral principles, or religious beliefs of the member and, in so far as practicable, may not use such beliefs as the basis of any adverse personnel action, discrimination, or denial of promotion, schooling, training, or assignment.

(2) DISCIPLINARY OR ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION.—Nothing in paragraph (1) precludes disciplinary or administrative action for conduct that is proscribed by chapter 47 of title 10, United States Code (the Uniform Code of Military Justice), including actions and speech that threaten good order and discipline.

(b) PROTECTION OF CHAPLAIN DECISIONS RELATING TO CONSCIENCE, MORAL PRINCIPLES, OR RELIGIOUS BELIEFS.—No member of the Armed Forces may—

(1) require a chaplain to perform any rite, ritual, or ceremony that is contrary to the conscience, moral principles, or religious beliefs of the chaplain; or

(2) discriminate or take any adverse personnel action against a chaplain, including denial of promotion, schooling,

training, or assignment, on the basis of the refusal by the chaplain to comply with a requirement prohibited by paragraph (1).

(c) REGULATIONS.—The Secretary of Defense shall issue regulations implementing the protections afforded by this section.

An association of military chaplains saw this as a restriction on how they could pray and meekly asked the government if they could create an order in allowing them to be able to pray in the name of Jesus. The secretary of the Navy then issues instructions saying there are no restrictions while you preach within your four walls of your little church but you better shut your mouth and not say Jesus at “command functions”.

An association that represents more than 70 percent of the chaplains in the U.S. military, including many evangelical Christians, is opposing a demand by conservatives in Congress for a presidential order guaranteeing the right of chaplains to pray in the name of Jesus.

The rising calls for an executive order are based on "confusion and misinformation," because Christian chaplains routinely pray in the name of Jesus, in public, thousands of times a week in military chapels around the world, said the Rev. Herman Keizer Jr., chairman of the National Conference on Ministry to the Armed Forces....

In a Feb. 21 instruction to commanders, the secretary of the Navy distinguished between prayers given by chaplains at "divine worship services" -- on which there are no restrictions -- and those delivered at "command functions" that people of many faiths are encouraged or required to attend.

"Absent extraordinary circumstances," any religious elements in a command ceremony "should be nonsectarian," it said. Air Force guidelines issued a few weeks earlier made essentially the same distinction, calling for "non-denominational, inclusive prayer" or a moment of silence at military ceremonies.

In 2013 The Department of Defense further states that one can evangelize but not proselytize.

"Service members can share their faith (evangelize), but must not force unwanted, intrusive attempts to convert others of any faith or no faith to one's beliefs (proselytization)," Pentagon spokesman Lt. Cmdr. Nate Christensen said in a written statement....

"Religious proselytization is not permitted within the Department of Defense," the statement read. "Court martials and non-judicial punishments are decided on a case-by-case basis."

Another example of weakening the Military morals came in 1993 when the military standards were loosened concerning gays in the military. In 1994 the Don't ask, Don't tell (DADT) policy was passed so that gays could be in the military as long as they didn't say that they were gay (gays were forced to stay in the closet). In 2011 DADT was removed and now today there is gay proselytizing approved by the military authorities.

"Don't ask, don't tell" (DADT) was the official United States policy on [service by gays and lesbians in the military](#) instituted by the Clinton Administration in February 28, 1994, when Department of Defense Directive 1304.26 issued on December 21, 1993, took effect,^[1]

This relaxation of legal restrictions on service by gays and lesbians in the armed forces was mandated by United States federal law [Pub.L. 103-160 \(10 U.S.C. § 654\)](#), which was signed November 30, 1993.^[2] The policy prohibited people who "demonstrate a propensity or intent to engage in homosexual acts" from serving in the [armed forces of the United States](#), because their presence "would create an unacceptable risk to the high standards of morale, good order and discipline, and unit cohesion that are the essence of military capability".^[3]

[Legislation to repeal DADT](#) was enacted in December 2010, specifying that the policy would remain in place until the [President](#), the [Secretary of Defense](#), and the [Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff](#) certified that repeal would not harm military readiness, followed by a 60-day waiting period.^[7] A July 6, 2011, ruling from a federal appeals court barred further enforcement of the U.S. military's ban on openly gay service members.^[8] President [Barack Obama](#), Secretary of Defense [Leon Panetta](#), and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Admiral [Mike Mullen](#) sent that certification to Congress on July 22, 2011, which set the end of DADT to September 20, 2011.^[9]

The law was signed a week after President Obama described the legislation as **morally wrong** and said that it “will be a step backward for all Ugandans.” Enacting it, he added, “will **complicate our valued relationship** with Uganda.”

Other Western nations, including **Britain, Belgium, Denmark and Sweden**, also condemned the law, with some saying they will reconsider their aid to Ugandan government programs as a result.

In many countries, such as Uganda and Nigeria, homosexuality has been **criminalized since British colonial rule**, but the laws were seldom enforced. The rapid spread of evangelical forms of Christianity and Islam, both preaching a conservative vision of the family, has convinced many Africans that homosexuality should be eradicated. **Today, 38 of Africa’s 54 countries** have banned same-sex relationships, according to Amnesty International.

The United States is Uganda’s largest donor, giving more than **\$400 million in aid** annually. Kerry said the administration will conduct “an internal review of our relationship” with the Ugandan government “to ensure that all dimensions of our engagement, including assistance programs, uphold our anti-discrimination policies and principles and reflect our values.”

GENERAL ORDER NUMBER 1C (GO-1C)*

TITLE: Prohibited Activities for U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) Personnel Present Within the U.S. Central Command (USCENTCOM) Area of Responsibility (AOR).

k. Religious Matters.

(1) This Order prohibits entrance into a mosque or other site of Islamic religious significance by non-Muslims, unless directed to do so by military authorities, required by military necessity, or as part of an official tour conducted with the nondelegable approval of a commander in the grade of O-6 or higher and the host-nation. This prohibition does not apply to Service members and DOD civilians, their families, or official visitors of the Office of Military Cooperation in Egypt when visits to mosques or other sites of Islamic religious significance in Egypt are tourist sites, open to non-Muslims, and approved for visitation in advance by the Chief, Military Cooperation, Egypt. Commanders may further restrict this provision when warranted by the local security situation.

(2) This Order prohibits creating or reproducing an image or likeness of the Prophet Muhammad.

(3) This Order prohibits intentionally desecrating or defiling the following:

(a) religious items or symbols (regardless of the religion);

(b) religious holy books, such as the Qur'an, Bible, or Torah;

(c) any religious shrine or place of worship (such as a church or mosque);

(d) national flags containing religious notations (such as the Afghanistan, Saudi, and Iraqi national flags);

(e) any historical or cultural artifact, relic, or location.

(f) The term, "desecrating" includes divesting or diverting from a sacred to a profane use or purpose by blasphemous, sacrilegious, irreverent, contemptuous, or disrespectful action. The term "defiling" includes actions or words that are abusive, cruel, indecent, reproachful, or detract from the significance, status, or position of a person or property.

(4) This Order prohibits proselytizing of any religion, faith, or practice to local nationals or third country nationals in countries in the USCENTCOM AOR. This rule does not prohibit Chaplains from performing their official religious duties.

(5) Internment of deceased Muslim will be done in accordance with Muslim religious practice and customs. This Order prohibits burning or cremating Muslim remains under any circumstances.
