

Food drive Biblical Christmas Quiz - December 11, 2014



How much do you know of the Christmas story as it is laid out in the Bible? Do you have enough biblical swagger to know the correct order sequence of Jesus' birth events without making a single mistake?

Imagine that you are in a 'Christmas Bible knowledge game show' and you are a finalist. The last task, if you choose to accept, before taking home the grand prize is to correctly order a list of events centered around Jesus' birth. Do you know your bible enough to knock it out of the park?

The host of the show is gracious and merciful and doesn't want you to lose your prize so he is making it very easy - it's an open Bible challenge. But wait - there's more! Not only is it open Bible, the host is giving all the passages for you to read so instead of reading the entire bible cover to cover which contains **31,102** verses - you as a contestant would only have to read **87** verses.

The host of the show is also giving you as many lifelines as you can use. You may call, talk, text, IM, email.... Someone else for support and confirmation.

Did I mention you have only 1 chance to get it right? No do overs. Only one submission accepted.

Paul mentioned in 1 Cor9:24-27 to run a race to win it and not to run aimlessly. Don't mark down what you believe is the answer without first verifying it first within the scriptures (Acts 17:11).

To make finding the phrase even easier, the exact phrase is "quoted" that is to be found. The bible being used is the 1995 New American Standard Bible (NASB). What if you don't own a NASB bible? No problem. Go to the following link: <http://qbible.com/nasb-new-american-standard-bible-1995/>

RSV 1 Corinthians 9:24-27

24 Do you not know that **in a race** all the runners compete, but only one receives the prize? So **run that you may obtain it.**

25 Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable.

26 Well, I **do not run aimlessly**, I do not box as one beating the air;

27 but I pommel my body and subdue it, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

If you should decide to compete then what is the reward?

Paul quotes Jesus in Acts 20:35 saying '*It is more blessed to give than to receive.*' The prize is providing food & drink, caring for the sick and welcoming the prisoner as directed by Matthew 25:34-35. LEVITICUS 12: 2 - 8

	Joseph, Mary and Jesus flee to Egypt <i>“Joseph got up and took the Child and His mother while it was still night and left for Egypt”</i>	
	Joseph and Mary head to Bethlehem for the Census <i>“Joseph also went up from Galilee from the city of Nazareth”</i>	
	Joseph, Mary and Jesus arrive home <i>“and came and lived in a city called Nazareth”</i>	
	Shepherds are visited by angels in the field <i>“shepherds staying out in the fields”... ”suddenly there appeared with the angel a multitude of heavenly host praising God...”</i>	
	King Herod orders the killing of all the male children under 2 years old in Bethlehem <i>“when Herod saw that he had been tricked... sent and slew all the male children who were in Bethlehem and all its vicinity from two years old and under...”</i>	
	Wise men arrive and presents their gifts to Jesus <i>“they saw the Child with Mary His mother; and they fell to the ground and worshiped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they presented to Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh”</i>
