

A lone wolf or lone-wolf fighter is someone who commits or prepares for, or is suspected of committing or preparing for, violent acts in support of some group, movement, or ideology, but who does so alone, outside of any command structure and without material assistance from any group.



In the U.S. legal context, the lone wolf is associated with the U.S. terror-law FISA, bearing in mind that U.S. terror-law comprises non-violent, as well as violent acts. Moreover, a lone wolf can be so defined on the mere basis of suspicion ("reasonable belief", not actual charges). Probable cause is not required.

The government has said that the Homeland security apparatus is set up to capture lone wolf terrorist since terrorism is our national enemy. The United Nations define terrorism as:

13. **Criminal acts intended or calculated to provoke a state of terror in the general public**, a group of persons or particular persons for political purposes are in any circumstance **unjustifiable**, whatever the considerations of a political, philosophical, ideological, racial, ethnic, religious or any other nature that may be invoked to justify them.

What a wicked government fears the most is the **lone sheep terrorist**. They are unpredictable since they can't infiltrate, subvert and tear down the highest command structure - Jesus.

These terrorists are part of a larger group called the body of Christ (1Cor12:12). One is baptized into the body (1Cor12:13) with Jesus as the head (Eph5:23). Jesus directs the members on various missions with the right hand not knowing what the left hand is up to (Mt6:3, Jn3:8) but all members coming together to complete a mission.

1Co 12:12 For as the **body** is one, and hath many members, and all the members **of** that one **body**, being many, are one **body**: so also *is* **Christ**.

1Co 12:13 For by one Spirit are we all **baptized into one body**, whether *we be* Jews or Gentiles, whether *we be* bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit.

Eph 5:23 For **the** husband is **the head** of **the** wife, even as **Christ** is **the head** of **the** church: and he is **the** saviour of **the** **body**.

Mat 6:3 But when thou doest alms, **let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth**:

Joh 3:8 The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, **but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth**: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.

When you have 2 people boxing each other, one member of the body is used as a distraction while the other member or fist is getting ready to give the enemy a upper cut.



Same with the body of Christ, Jesus uses each member in a specific way with each member may or may not see who or what another member is up to. The smallest fighting unit is the 1 sheep fighting soldier.

As a single resistant fighter one has the advantage of surprise but as a single fighter one doesn't always make it home alive after the attack to tell the stories of great battle victories. Ecc4:9-10 states that 2 are better than 1 because if one falls the other picks him up and 3 is much better than 2.

RSV Ecclesiastes 4:9,10,12

9 **Two are better than one**, because they have a good reward for their toil.

10 For if they fall, **one will lift up his fellow**; but woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up.

12 And though **a man might prevail against one who is alone**, **two will withstand him. A threefold cord is not quickly broken.**

I'll go thru some of the biblical examples of 1, 2 and 3 fighting groups. Ones chances by themselves is not very good as a single individual fighter. There are more cases of those who don't make it back home than those that do make it back home after a mission.

Single sheep fighter

- a) Samson victory then loss (Judg16:17-19)
- b) Nameless prophet (1Kg13:1-34)
- c) Moses weakened with staff Ex17:11
- d) David against Lion and Bear and Giant, probably had his share of dogs and wolves
- e) Elijah - fire destroying 50 soldiers coming to arrest him twice



a) Samson was incredibly strong but not in the mind and there in his mind was his weakness. He lusted after Delilah who was from a people God said you shouldn't marry into. He didn't listen and her constant asking wore him down until he spilled the beans on his power source (his hair). He failed to listen to council and was imprisoned, got his eyes poked out and eventually died.

b) The nameless prophet was to go warn King Jeroboam to repent and leave not stopping to eat. An old prophet lied and said he heard the voice of the Lord for the nameless prophet to return and dine with him. The nameless prophet was weak in his conviction and went back and dined with the old prophet. God told the nameless prophet he was going to die for his disobedience and on his return a lion came out and killed him.

c) Moses had his moments of weakness of physical strength and endurance when he had to hold his staff over his head while Joshua and the Israelites were fighting Amalik. When Moses hands were lowered then the Isarelites were losing.

There are 2 examples of successful single fighters that made it back home to tell the stories:

d) David tells King Saul that he successfully went up against a bear and lion as a shepherd. David goes out and slays Goliath. A very successful warrior. David made it back home.


e) Elijah was another example of a successful warrior. King Ahab sent out 3 groups of 51 men to go get Elijah. The first 2 groups of 51 men died when Elijah called down fire from heaven. The third group humbling ask Elijah to come to the King. Elijah made it back home.

When 2 lone sheep resistant fighters link up then there is exponential increase of power of one going against 1,000 and 2 against 10,000 fighters (Dt32:30).

Deu 32:30 How should one chase a thousand, and two put ten thousand to flight...

Fighting sheep pair

- a) Jos7:11-13 Joshua's army was defeated at Ai by one bad soldier
- b) 1 Sam 14:6-10 Jonathon and shield bearer - victory on either side
- c) Lk10:1, 9:1-3 Jesus sent Apostles and 70 in pairs
- d) Acts13:2 Paul and Barnabas



In Ecc4:12 it's stated that 2 will be able to withstand but that is dependent on the other helper.

a) Joshua's army lost to the city of Ai by one soldier disobeying orders. They were to destroy everything in the city of Jericho however one soldier kept some of the items he found in the city.

b) Jonathon and his shield bearer were uncertain of their chances of success of 2 going against an army. They waited for a sign from God before proceeding.

1Sa 14:6 And Jonathan said to the young man that bare his armour, Come, and let us go over unto the garrison of these uncircumcised: it may be that the LORD will work for us: for *there is* no restraint to the LORD to save by many or by few.

1Sa 14:7 And his armourbearer said unto him, Do all that *is* in thine heart: turn thee; behold, I *am* with thee according to thy heart.

1Sa 14:8 Then said Jonathan, Behold, we will pass over unto *these* men, and we will discover ourselves unto them.

1Sa 14:9 If they say thus unto us, Tarry until we come to you; then we will stand still in our place, and will not go up unto them.

1Sa 14:10 But if they say thus, Come up unto us; then we will go up: for the LORD hath delivered them into our hand: and this *shall be* a sign unto us.

c) Jesus sent out the Apostles and the 70 in groups of 2

Luk 10:1 After these things the Lord appointed other seventy also, and sent them **two and two** before his face into every city and place, whither he himself would come.

d) The Holy Spirit created a two man team of Saul and Barnabas for a specific mission knowing that 2 are better than one.

Act 13:2 As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them.

Act 13:3 And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid *their* hands on them, they sent *them* away.

An even better fighting team is when 3 lone sheep link up for a mission. Ecc4:12 states that a 3 man team is not easily broken. Some examples of 3 man teams are:

Trifecta sheep fightin group

- a) 2Sam23:16 David's mighty men 3 to get water
- b) Moses Ex17:12 Moses, Aaron and Hur strengthen
- c) Acts 18:4-5 Paul, Silas, Timothy



a) 3 of King David's mighty men were strong enough to fight their way thru the enemy lines alone to grab some water for King David. All three came back alive.

2Sa 23:15 And David longed, and said, Oh that one would give me drink of the water of the well of Bethlehem, which *is* by the gate!

2Sa 23:16 And **the three mighty men brake through the host of the Philistines, and drew water out of the well of Bethlehem, that *was* by the gate, and took *it*, and brought *it* to David:** nevertheless he would not drink thereof, but poured it out unto the LORD.

b) When Moses was physically exhausted of holding his staff while Joshua was fighting Amalik, Aaron and Hur helped Moses arms and thus was able to defeat Amalek.

c) Paul got spiritual strength when Silas and Timothy came to him which it didn't seem he had just as an individual.

Act 18:4 And he reasoned in the synagogue every sabbath, and persuaded the Jews and the Greeks.

Act 18:5 And when Silas and Timotheus were come from Macedonia, Paul was pressed in the spirit, and testified to the Jews *that Jesus was Christ*.



Advice

If it's possible always have a spiritual wingman with you if you go out and preach the word. Two is better than one and three is better than two

Paul went where there was no knowledge of Jesus and built a local church (Rm15:20)

Rom 15:20 Yea, so have I strived to preach the gospel, not where Christ was named, lest I should build upon another man's **foundation**:

Paul sought the advice of Christians for a solid believer that could accompany him on his journeys. In Acts16:1-3, the local Christians recommended Timothy.

Act 16:1 Then came he to Derbe and Lystra: and, behold, **a certain disciple was there, named Timotheus**, the son of a certain woman, which was a Jewess, and believed; but his father *was* a Greek:

Act 16:2 **Which was well reported of by the brethren that were at Lystra and Iconium.**

Act 16:3 Him would Paul have to go forth with him; and took and circumcised him because of the Jews which were in those quarters: for they knew all that his father was a Greek.

There is dos and don'ts of fellow workers.

1) All the workers must agree together on salvation truths (Amos3:3) otherwise confusion will ensure.

Amo 3:3 Can two walk together, except they be agreed?

Imagine the confusion if a 'faith only', 'water-regenerater', Mormon and catholic all go out together to preach Jesus and salvation. The message would be confused.

- The faith only-ist will stop at believe and the sinner's prayer.
- The water regenerater will go past belief and stress repentance and water baptism.
- The Mormon can baptize you after you are dead.
- The catholic will stress that the person must place belief in the infallibility of the pope even if the bible contradicts what the pope says.

2) A fellow worker must be your friend. You are to test all friends before calling them your friends. There is an interview process found in the apocrypha of finding out what he believes by asking him questions and hearing his responses (Apoc Ecc6:7, 27:7)

Apoc ECC 6:7 **If thou wouldest get a friend, prove him first**, and be not hasty to credit him.

Apoc ECC 27:7 **Praise no man before thou hearest him speak**; for this is the trial of man.

3) Lastly, don't do anything without council. Had Samson and the nameless prophet heeded this advice then they would have overcome their weakness. The apocrypha states to seek council for every action:

Apoc Ecc 37:15-16

:15 And above all this pray to the most High, that he will direct they way in truth

:16 **Let reason go before every enterprise, and council before every action.**

The ultimate council is the word of God.

RSV Judges 16:16-19

16 And when she pressed him hard with her words day after day, and urged him, his soul was vexed to death.

17 And he told her all his mind, and said to her, "A razor has never come upon my head; for I have been a Nazirite to God from my mother's womb. If I be shaved, then my strength will leave me, and I shall become weak, and be like any other man."

18 When Delilah saw that he had told her all his mind, she sent and called the lords of the Philistines, saying, "Come up this once, for he has told me all his mind." Then the lords of the Philistines came up to her, and brought the money in their hands.

19 She made him sleep upon her knees; and she called a man, and had him shave off the seven locks of his head. Then she began to torment him, and his strength left him.

RSV 1 Kings 13:11-24

11 Now there dwelt an old prophet in Bethel. And his sons came and told him all that the man of God had done that day in Bethel; the words also which he had spoken to the king, they told to their father.

12 And their father said to them, "Which way did he go?" And his sons showed him the way which the man of God who came from Judah had gone.

13 And he said to his sons, "Saddle the ass for me." So they saddled the ass for him and he mounted it.

14 And he went after the man of God, and found him sitting under an oak; and he said to him, "Are you the man of God who came from Judah?" And he said, "I am."

15 Then he said to him, "Come home with me and eat bread."

16 And he said, "I may not return with you, or go in with you; neither will I eat bread nor drink water with you in this place;

17 for it was said to me by the word of the Lord, 'You shall neither eat bread nor drink water there, nor return by the way that you came.'"

18 And he said to him, "I also am a prophet as you are, and an angel spoke to me by the word of the Lord, saying, 'Bring him back with you into your house that he may eat bread and drink water.'" **But he lied to him.**

19 So he went back with him, and ate bread in his house, and drank water.

20 And as they sat at the table, the word of the Lord came to the prophet who had brought him back;

21 and he cried to the man of God who came from Judah, "Thus says the Lord, 'Because you have disobeyed the word of the Lord, and have not kept the commandment which the Lord your God commanded you,

23 And after he had eaten bread and drunk, he saddled the ass for the prophet whom he had brought back.

24 And as he went away a lion met him on the road and killed him. And his body was thrown in the road, and the ass stood beside it; the lion also stood beside the body.

RSV Exodus 17:8-11

8 Then came Amalek and fought with Israel at Rephidim.

9 And Moses said to Joshua, "Choose for us men, and go out, fight with Amalek; tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the rod of God in my hand."

10 So Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought with Amalek; and Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill.

11 **Whenever Moses held up his hand, Israel prevailed; and whenever he lowered his hand, Amalek prevailed.**

RSV Acts 9:22 **But Saul increased all the more in strength,** and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus was the Christ.

RSV 1 Samuel 17:34-37

34 But David said to Saul, "Your servant used to keep sheep for his father; and when there came a lion, or a bear, and took a lamb from the flock,

35 I went after him and smote him and delivered it out of his mouth; and if he arose against me, I caught him by his beard, and smote him and killed him.

36 Your servant has killed both lions and bears; and this uncircumcised Philistine shall be like one of them, seeing he has defied the armies of the living God."

37 And David said, "The Lord who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine." And Saul said to David, "Go, and the Lord be with you!"

RSV 2 Kings 1:9-12

9 Then the king sent to him a captain of fifty men with his fifty. He went up to Elijah, who was sitting on the top of a hill, and said to him, "O man of God, the king says, 'Come down.'"

10 But Elijah answered the captain of fifty, "If I am a man of God, let fire come down from heaven and consume you and your fifty." Then fire came down from heaven, and consumed him and his fifty.

11 Again the king sent to him another captain of fifty men with his fifty. And he went up and said to him, "O man of God, this is the king's order, 'Come down quickly!'"

12 But Elijah answered them, "If I am a man of God, let fire come down from heaven and consume you and your fifty." Then the fire of God came down from heaven and consumed him and his fifty.

1 AFTER THIS the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come.

2 And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.

3 Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves.

4 Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and salute no one on the road.

RSV Luke 9:1-3

1 AND HE called the twelve together and gave them power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases,

2 and he sent them out to preach the kingdom of God and to heal.

3 And he said to them, "Take nothing for your journey, no staff, nor bag, nor bread, nor money; and do not have two tunics.

RSV Acts 13:2 While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

RSV Joshua 7:11-12

11 Israel has sinned; they have transgressed my covenant which I commanded them; they have taken some of the devoted things; they have stolen, and lied, and put them among their own stuff.

12 Therefore the people of Israel cannot stand before their enemies; they turn their backs before their enemies, because they have become a thing for destruction. I will be with you no more, unless you destroy the devoted things from among you.

RSV Exodus 17:12-13

12 But Moses' hands grew weary; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat upon it, and Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; so his hands were steady until the going down of the sun.

13 And Joshua mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword.
